



Staffing Update

It is wonderful to be back at school and to be made so welcome by staff, parents and of course our amazing children. I would like to thank the whole school community, especially the staff, for working together so effectively in my absence. I couldn't ask for a better team to work with.

During my absence 2024 has been a busy year and there have been several changes with new children and new members of staff being welcomed into our school community.

Mrs Gore-Rowe kindly stepped in to support as acting head during my absence and I am very grateful for all her hard work and support during that time.

We have appointed two amazing teaching assistants. In February we were Joined by Teaching assistant Miss Ball, who is working with our year 2 team. We have also been recently been joined by Teaching assistant Mrs Smith. Who is working with our younger children in EYFS.

I know you will share with me both feelings of sadness and enormous pride, when I tell you that Miss Rogers is leaving our school at the end of this school year. She is starting a new role as a teacher at Churchill park Complex needs school, where her wide skill set and passion for supporting children with additional needs will make a huge difference to the lives of children and their families. Miss Rogers has worked at the school for nineteen years in several roles - as Parent support advisor, Teaching assistant, instructor, teacher and SENCO. Her connections with the school go back further however as she attended the school as a child herself. She will be greatly missed by all.

I am very pleased to share that we have secured an amazing teacher to join our team in September. Miss Sewell, who like Miss Rogers, worked at Highgate as a TA and trained to be a teacher with us, has agreed to return to Highgate. In the last 3 years she has worked successfully in a range of schools and acquired a wealth of knowledge and experience. The staff team are thrilled that she is returning and I know will be welcomed by children and parents alike.

Fencing

Safety and security for our children is important to us all and I was very pleased to see the installation of the new fence and the taking down of the ugly green mesh. The wall, though very nice, was low and constructed in such a way that it could be climbed from both the path and playground. Members of the public could also approach children easily and children could reach through the fence onto a busy path where bicycles dogs, pushchairs and mobility scooters all posed a potential risk. The new perimeter fence ensures security and safety for all our children. It also adds to the children's fun, as hopefully less balls and beanbags will escape during playtimes!

A few parents have voiced a concern regarding the space on the playground between the wall and fence. The small area of playground we lose was already a 'no go area' with a yellow line acting as a visible reminder that children should not be close to the wall due to safety.
