We are thrilled to welcome Miss Gourlay and Miss Sewell to our staff.


Miss Gourlay is our new Personal care assistant, she will be supporting those who need help with personal care across the school and will also be supporting learning in the classrooms.

Miss Sewell is our new Reception class teacher. As well as leading EYFS, she is also our Reading Leader and will be championing our Read Write Inc phonics programme across the school.

All About Us

Our whole school topic this half term is 'All About Us. It'. Our classes are exploring this in creative ways.







Our Reception class are looking at who we are and what our place is in the world.

They are looking at themselves and what makes them unique. They are also learning about the different ways we may feel and how we can recognise and describe those emotions.

They will be also be looking at different homes and starting to think about history - how homes in the past differ from homes today.









In year 1 they are learning about two famous nurses from history Edith Cavell and Mary Seacole. They are also learning more about their bodies in science and have a role play hospital in the outdoor learning area and a wellness salon inside the classroom.





In year 2 the children are learning about the UK, its countries, capital cities and characteristics. They are also learning about how to keep their bodies healthy including hygiene, exercise and diet.







After half term all classes will be thinking about Celebrations, in this country and around the world. We will start to talk about this topic during our Harvest celebrations on October 25th and whilst learning about Firework and Bonfire Safety on November the 4th.





Jury Service

Miss West has been called for Jury Service starting on October 7th. This means that she **may** be in court in Kings Lynn and not at school from October 7th. If she is not required to serve, she will be in school as usual. We will keep you informed regarding class cover if and when Miss West is required in court.

The chances of being called for Jury Service vary depending on where you live. **In England and Wales, the chance is 35%**. Only about half of those people will spend any time in court.

Allotment

The school allotment is in great need of TLC. The children do a great job of taking care of the vegetables we plant, but some jobs can be a bit big and we need a little help! If you are able to help us out from time to time — whether as a weeder, waterer or with a bit of DIY or maintenance then please see let your child's class teacher or Mrs Kirby's know or speak to our allotment champion Mrs Griffin.



Home School Reading

Children reading at red level and above bring home 3 books, a library book, the book they have read in Read Write Inc and a book bag book that compliments the book they have been reading in Read Wite Inc. Children reading sound blending books and Ditties will bring home a Library book and a book focused on learning to blend to read.

Children new to the school and those learning the first 16 sounds will bring home a library book and can practice the sounds they are learning using the Read Write Inc pages in the Reading records.

Attendance

Going to school regularly is important for your child's future. For example, children who miss school often can fall behind with their work and do less well in exams.

Arranging appointments and outings after school hours, at weekends or during school holidays will help to prevent disruption to your child's education and to the school. Under normal circumstances you should not expect the school to agree to your child going on holiday during term time.

Please ensure you phone the office every day if your child is not well enough to attend.

Children need to bring PE kits to school so they can change into their PE kits for every PE lesson. This term the focus for our PE is dance.

Behaviour

If the school has any concerns about a child's behaviour, they will contact parents. If any parents have concerns, please come into school and share those concerns. We want each and every child to feel safe and secure and staff will always be there to help children with any personal, social or emotional issues.

Start of the day

Staff are always happy to talk to parents about their children. If you would like to speak to your child's class teacher then it is best to see them after school once they no longer have a class to teach. If you do need to discuss something in the morning that is important for your child in the coming day, then please speak briefly to the teacher on the playground between 8.40 and 8.45. The bell is rung at 8.45, at this time all children need to head into class with the class teacher. The start of the school day is very busy and staff need to head in promptly to ensure the children are supported.



Harvest Festival



We will be celebrating Harvest on October 25th in the afternoon.

Our hall is not quite big enough for all our children and parents to gather together in, so we will have three celebrations at 2.45pm. Year 1 on the 22^{nd} Oct, Year 2 on the 23^{rd} of Oct and Year R on the 24^{th} Oct.
